} To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas, Lorenzo Easterday, of Ellis County, Kansas,

has deposited in the GENERAL LAND OFFICE of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Hays City, Kansas, whereby it appears that full payment has been made by the said

Lorenzo Easterday,

according to the provisions of

the Act of Congress of the 24th of April, 1820, entitled "An Act making further provision for the sale of the Public Lands," for

and the acts supplemental thereto, for the north half of the south-west quarter of section two, in township fifteen south, of range sixteen west, in the district of lands subject to sale at Hays City, Kansas, containing eighty acres,

according to the official plat of the survey of the said lands returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General, which said tract has been purchased by the said Lorenzo Easterday:

Now know ye, That the United States of America, in consideration of the premises, and in conformity with the several acts of Congress in such case made and provided, HAVE GIVEN AND GRANTED, and by these presents DO GIVE AND GRANT, unto the said Lorenzo Easterday

and to his heirs, the said tract above described: To HAVE AND TO HOLD the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said Lorenzo Easterday

and to his heirs and assigns forever.

In testimony whereof, I, Rutherford B. Hayes, PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, have caused these letters to be made patent, and the seal of the General Land Office to be hereunto affixed.
