Officers Have Clue

Members of the sheriff's department working on the case intimated today that they had developed a slight clue that might lead to arrests some time later today; but refused to give out any statements of how they hoped to link any persons with the fatal shooting of the Indian.

Relatives Arrive

Payton's body was identified yesterday by Wenzel McEachern, a student with Payton at Murray Agricultural school at Tishomingo last year, and by Walter Payton, a brother, who resides in Tishomingo. Walter Tishomingo county attorney of Bryan county, ran a mile of the young man, was in the city today working with county officials in an attempt to forestall the players of the year.

The body of the youth was discovered early yesterday morning on the Santa Fe tracks and police were not slow.

Funeral arrangements had not been completed today, but will be held Wednesday either from Caledonia or Hazel Payton's father, Ned Payton, lives on a farm twelve miles southwest of Howell, and other relatives reside near Caledonia.
