The Children of John Williams and Unity Stanley

John Williams, Jr. (1777?-1838?) married Unity Stanley (Aug. 1, 1780 – Dec. 9, 1831) on Feb. 10, 1797 in Fluvanna County, Virginia. Unity Stanley Williams was buried in Simpson County, Kentucky next to her parents, Solomon Stanley (1755-1836) and Elizabeth (maiden name unknown) Stanley (1751-1820). John and Unity moved from Fluvanna County, Virginia to Kentucky in the fall of 1805 (most likely in October). John and Unity settled in Henry County. Here is a list of their children known to have survived to adulthood:

- I. Elizabeth Perkins Williams (born Apr. 23, 1800 in Prince Edward County, Virginia) married Elisha H. Houseworth (1803-1879) on Feb. 19, 1829 in Henry County, Kentucky. Elizabeth, or "Betsy" as she was called, continued to live in Henry County and died there on Dec. 28, 1874. She and her spouse are buried in the Houseworth Family Cemetery, Henry County, Kentucky. She had six children:
 - a. Unity Stanley Houseworth (born Dec. 31, 1830 in Henry County, Kentucky) married Simpson Hathman Bicknell (1820-1896) on Dec. 31, 1849 in Henry County, Kentucky. She died on Feb. 20, 1905 in Henry County, Kentucky. Had issue.
 - Spotswood H. Houseworth (born Aug. 12, 1832 in Henry County, Kentucky)
 married Elizabeth M. Milton (1839-1921) on Feb. 25, 1871 in Henry County, Kentucky. He died on Jun. 19, 1915 in Shelby County, Kentucky. Had issue.
 - c. Mary Ellen Houseworth (born Dec. 3, 1835 in Henry County, Kentucky) died unmarried and childless on Aug. 20, 1887 in Jefferson County, Kentucky.
 - d. William W. Houseworth (born about 1839 in Henry County, Kentucky) corporal in Company G, Ninth Regiment Calvary, Kentucky Volunteers, Confederate Army during the Civil War. He was captured by Union forces and probably died in Indiana sometime in 1863. It is not known if he ever married or had any children.
 - e. Elisha Perkins Houseworth (born Mar. 19, 1843 in Henry County, Kentucky) private in Company G, Ninth Regiment Calvary, Kentucky Volunteers, Confederate Army during the Civil War. He was captured by Union forces but later released. He first married Eliza Jane Milton (1845 -?), the younger sister of his brother Spotswood's wife, on Oct. 22, 1871 in Henry County, Kentucky. Eliza Jane presumably died before he married secondly Eliza Agnes Vance (1847-1921), the widow of Thomas Jefferson Winburn (1843-1871), on Feb. 26, 1879 in Henry County, Kentucky. He died on Nov. 18, 1932 in Henry County, Kentucky. It does not appear that he had any children.
 - **f.** Susannah Ellis Houseworth (born Dec. 19, 1846 in Henry County, Kentucky) married Thomas Christopher Wingfield (1848-1932) on Dec. 18,
